The Undeclared major

At King's, we welcome students who aren't ready to decide on a major upon admission. In fact, one out of seven freshmen do not have a major when they register and most of them are still able to graduate in four years. Through the undeclared major

program, King's will provide you with a specially trained academic advisor who will help you to schedule your core courses as well as sample classes from different majors.

What courses do undeclared majors take?

Undeclared majors start by focusing their studies on core courses, which include history, science, literature, foreign languages and cultures, philosophy and psychology. Core courses make up nearly half of all of the classes you will need to graduate and by taking them early on, you will have more time to explore subjects and determine your career interests. Plus, you will have more time to focus on your major once you've decided on your field.

How will I choose a major that is right for me?

Your academic advisor will work closely with you and our Career Planning Office. Through their services, you will take various tests to assess your strengths and determine in which majors you may excel. You will also have the opportunity to meet professionals who will talk to you about their specialty areas and help you to decide on a career path. Eventually, you may consider a double major or minor to open even more options.

Will I still graduate in four years?

Definitely. An added bonus of the undeclared major is that you won't lose credits on coursework that is not applicable to your major, helping you to stay on track to graduate on time. Strategic planning and academic advising will help you earn your degree in four years.
