General Information:

A student must earn a minimum of 120 credit hours to be awarded the baccalaureate degree. The number of credit hours required for graduation may be higher in certain major programs <u>or</u> if the student elects to pursue a second major. Beyond the requirements of the Core Curriculum and of a student's chosen major program, the balances of the credit hours required for graduation are "free electives."

^{*}Students majoring in Philosophy are required to take PHIL 101, 170, and 173 OR, as an alternative sequence, HNRS 280, HNRS 281, and PHIL 170. These courses fulfill the Major requirements while satisfying the Core Introduction to Philosophy and Philosophical Investigations Core requirements. Students majoring in Philosophy are also required to complete a capstone paper. Ordinarily, the capstone paper will be completed by taking PHIL 490: Independent Senior Capstone Seminar in the spring of their senior year. See Philosophy Department Chair for details.
